<sup>\*</sup> The **tuition fee** was \$3790, of which we were requested to contribute \$1355 for each student. We have paid, so far, \$600 for each student (total **\$1800**).

# Nurses in short supply - what we are doing about it



We are paying for Ms. Esther S. to study for two and a half years at the Safed Hospital Nursing School, to become a **Registered Nurse**. She is a single mother with two small children; here she is with her younger daughter.

To date we have paid out **\$2470** as the first three installments of her tuition fees. The total sum needed for the coming two and a half years is \$7265.

When she qualifies she will have steady employment, and her studies will enable her to give her own children a head start.

### From a 2016 report:

Israel's health professional shortages, particularly in nursing, are among the most severe in the developed world. Increasing the absolute number of physicians and nurses ... is of utmost importance to solving the shortages.

We are playing our part.

# Israel's spiritual health is no less important than its physical health!

Idan T. spent last year studying at the prestigious Merkaz HaRav Yeshiva in Jerusalem, where we subsidized his studies at the rate of \$90 a month. This year he transferred to the Birkat Yosef "hesder" yeshiva, combining Torah learning with army service, which places a special emphasis on strengthening the bond with the people of Israel, the land of Israel and – needless to say – the Torah.

We pay a **monthly subsidy of \$176**. We were extremely gratified by the generosity of the USY's **Tikun Olam Fund**, which made us a grant of **\$1700** to cover this subsidy for 10 months.



## The more possessions, the more anxiety (Ethics of the Fathers / Pirkei Avot 2:7)



When the gas technician told Mrs. Hanna A. that her **cooker** was unrepairable, she had no choice but to buy a new one, costing \$723. Because her sons were unemployed due to Covid-19, she needed our support. We contributed **\$422** (58%) and she made up the rest.

A new immigrant, Mrs. Maritu B. needed a repair to her **refrigerator**, and this in the middle of the summer; we paid **80%** (\$120).



# Freeing parents to work

We also paid \$300 for two months in a day-care center for Netanel & Avishag W.'s infant son; this enables his parents to go out to work. Because of this arrangement Netanel has started working for an air-conditioners and solar heaters fitter, so that the family are more financially independent. The sum we paid was only 50% of the total they had to pay, which in itself had been reduced thanks to the intervention of the Safed City Welfare Dept.



## "Online learning laptops still not provided by Education Ministry"

That's the headline in the Jerusalem Post. The article continues:

As the coronavirus crisis continues to plague Israel ... with 150,000 laptops still unavailable to students six months after the beginning of the crisis.... an OECD survey which showed that about 9% of Israeli students have no means of partaking in online learning.

We have provided **laptops** to **nine students** (one in Safed, one in Jerusalem and seven in Ramla – in all cases there was a "Safed connection"), at a total cost of \$3004. The photo shows M.B., daughter of a former Safed resident now in Jerusalem, just after receiving her laptop.

In addition, at the request of Mr. Maru Zaudo, the director of one the Safed Absorption Centers, we paid \$947 for 17 webcams and 17 computer network cards to update their learning center.

## The Committee to the rescue!

According to the Israeli government plans to promote the integration of Ethiopian Israelis into Israeli society, Ingdau Y. was promised that they would pay all the **tuition fees** for his **Teaching with Advanced Technologies Certificate**, being an additional qualification to his M.A. Suddenly, after he was well into the first semester at the <u>Gordon College</u>, he was informed that they couldn't pay.



#### Ingdau wrote:

I'm now married with three children; my wife, Tabeva, who – like me – came to Safed as a child, is also studying to become an English teacher. We own our own apartment in Rosh HaAyin, but I continue to be Director of the Municipal Center for Ethiopian absorption in Yavne. I would never have reached so far had it not been for the stipend that the Committee gave me while I was at university [see September 2011 Newsletter, p.4]. Over and above that, I am so grateful for all the support that the Committee has extended to my family in Safed, and to my younger brother Ashato in particular [see Pesah 2019 Newsletter, p.2]: thanks to your help he is a star in his field (social work with drug addiction) and helps many professional colleagues.

We have so many financial responsibilities: mortgage payments, interest-free loan repayments, city rates, school fees for our children, my wife's tuition fees. If I have to stop my studies at the Gordon College, this will put paid to my hopes of getting better paid work and other positions in local government and/or the Ministry of Education.

I debated with myself for a long time before writing to you, I tried to raise the money from other sources, but to no avail.

We decided to pay the outstanding tuition fees (\$3400) in the course of the academic year, after Ingdau undertook to repay at least part after his situation stabilizes. To date we have paid \$1200.



## Widening horizons

With school hours cut down, on account of Covid-19, four teenage girls were thrilled at the opportunity to have **art lessons** in the Absorption Center. Once a week their teacher, Rivky, gives them an hour and a half session; she enjoys herself as much as they do! The Absorption Center supplies all the materials, and we pay the **\$90** fee for each lesson.




